As we begin a new adventure at Baldwin Community UMC, my prayer is that we can begin a community-wide and individual commitment to Christian discipleship. How can we create renewed passion for spiritual disciplines, sacred practices, and devotion that can bring about real, discernable change in our lives? Discipleship is our lifelong commitment to engage in a vibrant, ongoing conversation with God. Discipleship is a lifestyle of commitment and blessing.

Healthy discipleship possesses both a personal and social component balancing what we think God is saying to us with the blessing and wisdom we gain from being in sacred community. John Wesley was convinced that an isolated Christian was not the full embodiment of Christian personhood...we need each other to grow! And so, I invite you to find a place at Baldwin Community UMC where you can thrive and grow!


