# Pruning Encourages New Growth

**Pastor Pamela Gardner** Right now, in Northeastern Pennsylvania, vineyard workers are pruning back vines from last season to encourage new growth in the spring. It is hard to work with the bitter cold winds coming off the lake but essential for a good harvest toward the end of summer. These skilled laborers know well how much to prune off each vine and how to tie the branches to support the weight of new grapes. Without their determined effort, the grapevines would go wild, quickly producing unsellable grapes and brambles. Pruning is essential!

Jesus was very clear in His teaching on the vine and branches that ministry would not be easy or painless for those desiring to be his disciples. Faithful ministry means that, at times, we do the things we don't want to do and embrace changes we never thought possible. In John 15:8, when Jesus says, "This is my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples," He was also saying that faithfulness requires a pruning of heart and life. Disciples daringly prune all that no longer works or serves in order to build new growth, throwing the overgrowth into the flames. This barely makes sense as overgrowth looks fine to the untrained eye, but it's presence devastates any future harvest. Faithful pruning encourages new growth. Jesus, well aware of the harshness of pruning, brings a season of newness, encouraged by the spiritual gifts of obedience, patience, and dedication to pruning that builds the Kingdom of God now.

Our culture, no longer having an agricultural orientation, tends to miss the beauty of pruning as shared by Jesus in John 15:1-4. Pruning clears away growth that is unsustainable or out of season for the plant, our spiritual relationship with Jesus, and church ministries. Throughout 2021, we found ourselves needing to do some pruning or right-sizing in response to all that was happening around us. The pain of those changes still linger for us yet, in response to pruning or change, new opportunities for growth and vibrancy are now available to our church. By right-sizing, we've been able to give attention and resources to different parts of our ministry. The new growth has been surprising and wonderful!

In this newsletter, you will find articles sharing with you our ongoing effort to prune or right-size the ministries of Baldwin Community UMC. You will also find articles showing evidence of new growth sprouting and unexpected blessings as we faithfully minister to our community in grace. By all these works, may we be seen as Christ's own disciples.
