Here is what you can expect upon arriving at the church building on August 2nd:



 Please plan to park in the church lot on Doverdell Drive as the back lot will be closed. Please enter by the Asbury Hall entrance to access the elevator to the sanctuary. Feel free to pull into the church circle to drop off all passengers with mobility concerns.

Pamela Gardner, Senior Pastor • The Asbury entrance and Sanctuary doors will open at 9:30 am. Please wear your mask to worship! If you forget your mask, one will be provided for you. As you enter the building, you will be asked a series of questions (Have you been feeling sick? Have you been around others who have been sick?) and your temperature will be taken with a touch-free thermometer. Anyone with a fever of 100.5 or higher will not be allowed in the building.


Call to Prayer & Fasting

July 25th—26th

Fasting is a spiritual practice intended to deepen our relationship with God based on trust and obedience. As we return to our sanctuary for worship, we want to be in a good place with God as we recognize we are not returning for ourselves but to worship and praise a God known to us. Calling for a fast is an opportunity to create space to offer thanksgiving and awareness as we prepare for this return not by our own efforts. During this weekend, you are invited to create a fast by picking the day, the amount of time, the thing you are fasting from, and preparations you need to make for a successful fast. You might choose to fast from food, electronic gadgets, or any other distraction that impedes your relationship with God. As you pray and prepare, you might consider the following in your reflections.

- Am I ready to worship in person? Do I feel safe to return to the sanctuary?
- What have I learned about my relationship with God? With others? With myself?
- What blessings do I bring into worship that honor God and all around me?
- What changes are being worked out within me in response to pandemics of Covid-19 and racism?

I pray that the joy of deep listening to God in this time of fasting and prayer might move you into surprising and wondrous moments with our God.
