

At the beginning of her children's book, In God's Name, Sandy Eisenburg Sasso begins to weave her tale:

> "After God created the world, all living things on earth were given a name. The plants and the trees, the animals and the fish, and each person, young and old, had a special name. But no one knew the name for God. So each person searched for God's name."

This beautiful picture book lists the many names for God—names that describe the unique qualities of God and how God acts on our behalf. Slowly people discover that the names used speak deeply to some, but not all, as the characters look for understanding and connection with one another through the use of God's name.

> "And at that moment, the people knew that all the names for God were good, and no name was better than another. Then all at once their voices came together and they called God One. Everyone listened. Most of all, God."

It's the happy ending! Not only is God able to be named in community, but all hold the name of God as one perfect communion. Sasso's beautiful book taps into our deepest desire to be known by God and fellow humans, to live in a synchronicity that brings blessing and good to all.

Our strong God offers the faithful worshipper or disciple daily opportunity to rest safely in an unshakeable deity. 
presents Canton Spectacular Saturday, November 13, 2021






Worship with Us

Imagine not being able to go to school or work during your monthly cycle because you have no sanitary protection. When team members from The Nyadire Connection learned of this problem in 2011, it led to the creation of The Girl's Empowerment Pad Program. After consulting with Zimbabwean women, volunteers downloaded patterns for sewing reusable cotton sanitary napkins, gathered fabric, collected donations, and converted electric sewing machines to manual. Now, leaders in both Pittsburgh and Nyadire continue to collaborate in order to support this extraordinary program!

TNC is a 100% volunteer, faith based, non-profit organization that was founded in 2006. This group practices non-toxic charity and sustainable development while seeking to support and sustain the Nyadire United Methodist Mission in northeastern Zimbabwe, Africa. TNC is made up of various programs centered around education, health, agriculture, outreach, and more! Teams frequently visit the mission to collaborate with our partners in Zimbabwe with a focus on relationship building. During each visit, crafts are ethically purchased to support local artists (some from Nyadire). All proceeds from sales go to The Nyadire Connection.
