Donations Requested

Daily Bread is a feeding program that is a part of our Outreach Ministries. This ministry feeds the local homeless or people having a hard time making ends meet. Due to the pandemic, there are more people in need of help and the individual foods that we must serve are more expensive than buying in bulk. To help lower the cost, we are accepting donations of sports drinks, bottled juice, plain bottled water, and fresh fruit. Items are placed in to go bags. If you like to bake, we can make arrangements for drop off at the church building. We typically serve 140 people each time. The upcoming dates are March 21st, May 30th, June 27th, Aug 8th, Oct 3rd, and Dec 5th. If you have any questions or would like to get involved, contact Liz Pollock.

Over the past few months I find myself being drawn to the song "Evidence" by Josh Baldwin. The chorus of the song goes like this "... I see the evidence of Your goodness, All over my life, All over my life. I see Your promises in fulfillment, All over my life, all over my life." This has been a rough year for so many, but the evidence of God's goodness and the hope that He brings are very much evident in the ministries of Baldwin Community UMC. Together the congregation of Baldwin Community UMC and the local community have helped support those in need in the following ways:

- Provided/served meals to those who experience homelessness (Daily Bread)
- Provided boxes of food to families in need (Lord's Pantry)
- Collected basic necessities for those in need (8th Avenue)
- Donated approximately 93 gifts to children/adults in need so that they might experience one of the joys of Christmas (Angel Tree)
- Sponsored students education (Hearing Impaired Program)
- Collected cleaning supplies to help individuals who have experienced a disaster (UMCOR)
- Advocated to stop hunger by writing letters requesting our state representatives to support legislation of various food programs (Bread for the World)

On behalf of the Outreach team, I say thank you. Thank you for showing God's love and being a blessing to others who are in need. Thank you for answering God's call and being just a small piece of "THE EVIDENCE" of God's goodness and hope. The Outreach team is looking forward to seeing how we can continue to be a blessing in the coming year, and we hope that you will join us on that journey.
